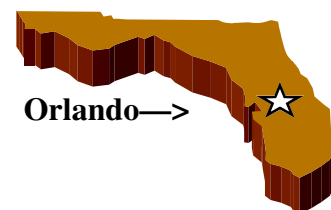

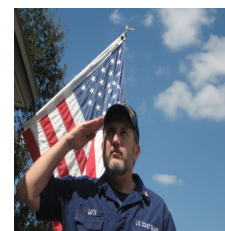

## Chaplain's Message

FDR

The inauguration of President Trump caused my mind to go back to my childhood, when the terms APresident@ and ARoosevelt@ to me as a young child were synonymous. Throughout my early years, Franklin Delano Roosevelt was the only president I ever knew (he was elected to four terms and served from 1932 until his death in 1945).

He was very prominent during that time, first as leader during the great depression, and then as our President during World War II. From the time I learned to read, I would see on just about a daily basis newspaper headlines that included AFDR,@ that being the abbreviation used to refer to Mr. Roosevelt. There was no television in those days, radio news generally was very brief, and newspapers ruled the day as virtually the sole source of information.

Thus I grew up with APresident,@ ARoosevelt,@ and AFDR@ all the same thing in my young mind.

Numerous factors keep any child from that particular confusion today. For one thing, no one else will ever serve more than two terms as President, given the constitutional amendment that was passed after Mr. Roosevelt=s death to prevent it. Then too, most today get most of their news from sources other than newspapers, so ATrump,@ or ADJT@ are not likely to be burned into any child=s mind as being synonymous with APresident@ (that=s not a comment for or against President Trump, just an expression of the different time we live in).

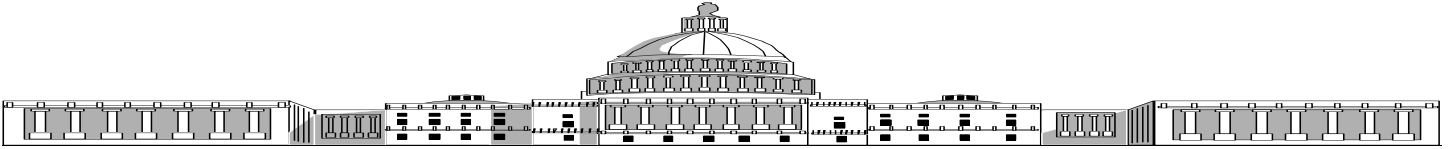
Far more meaningful, though, than my childhood impressions of President Roosevelt (and that=s not a negative reference to him, either) is what the Christian Bible tells me about Someone else:

Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever (Hebrews 13:8). That long time in a terribly high pressure office burned Mr. Roosevelt out, and he passed away in April, 1945, but our Lord never burns out, and He will always be there for us.

As the psalmist put it: Some *trust* in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the LORD our God. (Ps. 20:7). We should pray for President Trump, but there=s just One Who is permanent and it=s not Roosevelt, Obama, or Trump; may your trust be in Him!

**STEPS TO SUBSCRIBE TO MOAA'S WEEKLY LEGISLATIVE UPDATE AND CONTACT YOUR LEGISLATORS ONLINE**

**A. Subscribe to MOAA's free weekly legislative update:**

1. Click "Login" at [www.moaa.org](http://www.moaa.org) First time login? Have MOAA member # and your email address handy and click "Create Web Login" & follow prompts.
2. When logged in click Account then "My Subscriptions & Notifications".
3. On next screen, enter your email address and click "Search".
4. Your profile page will come up. Check the MOAA Legislative Update box (and any other email newsletters you'd like to receive). Click on "Home" in upper right corner to return to home page.

**B. Take action anytime or when prompted by MOAA's weekly update:**

1. At the MOAA home page ([www.moaa.org](http://www.moaa.org)), click "Take Action" and select "Legislative Action Center" in the drop down menu.
2. Under featured alert, click "Take Action".
3. Confirm or correct your zip code and click "Go"
4. Review/edit the suggested email and complete your sender info at bottom
5. Important: if using your own computer, check the box that says "Remember Me" at bottom of form, then click "Send Message"

**C. Find where your legislators stand on MOAA supported bills and send them an email about those they have not yet co-sponsored:**

1. At the MOAA home page ([www.moaa.org](http://www.moaa.org)), click "Take Action".
2. Click on "Legislative Action Center" then "Elected Officials". Enter your zip code and click "Go"
3. Click on "Bills" under any of your legislators
4. Click on "Send Message". Review or edit the suggested message, verify your contact info is correct, and click "Send".
5. Repeat these steps for each bill your legislator hasn't co-sponsored.
7. Repeat for each of your legislators.

**D. No computer? Call MOAA member services (800) 234-6622 and listen to the current legislative update, then call your congressmen.**

### THE NAVY EXCHANGE SAVES YOU MONEY

Navy Exchange prices are an average of 15.8% below the competition. This savings is determined by "Market Basket" surveys. The Navy Exchange Service Command hired an independent consulting firm to conduct price surveys three times per year. Prices are compared on 350 exchange items, in eight geographic areas throughout the United States with such retailers as Wal-Mart, Target, Circuit City, and Sears. The results showed that customers save an average of 15.8% (excluding sales tax savings). In the State of Florida, the total savings would be 21.8% which includes the 15.8% average plus the 6% sales tax.
