If you have a family, one of the most important things you can do during your lifetime is laying out the plans to take care of your family after you die. Upon your death, your survivors can expect to receive certain payments and benefits from the federal government, but it's up to you to help your survivors.

Personnel at this office are all retired military and they can provide you with the various agencies and telephone numbers to include notifying the retired finance center.

Your survivors should know the location of your insurance policies, retirement orders, birth certificate, your current Retiree Account Statement and any other documents of importance before and after your death.



Sarah Polk was a devote Christian. Her husband was rather ambivalent when it came to spiritual things, but, in this area also, he followed Sarah's lead. She insisted and the two of them attended two church services every Sunday–for a total of four-to-six hours total. Anyone who came in to meet with the President on a Sunday had to go along with them—the word got out, don't meet with the President on Sunday unless you want to spend six hours in church!

God blessed America during Mr. Polk's term. We acquired Texas, New Mexico, Nevada, California, Oregon, Washington, and portions of other states as well during his short four years in office. One can argue the fairness of our snatching the lower states away from Mexico—some say we provoked Mexico into war; others say it was the other way round—but it cannot be denied that these acquisitions brought America to the Pacific coast and to the greatness it enjoyed thereafter.

I'd like to think that Sarah Polk's devotion to the Lord had something to do with that.

MOAA Wants Your Pharmacy Feedback

Recently, MOAA joined a gathering of senior leaders at the Defense Health Agency (DHA) to discuss improvements for the TRICARE health plan.

Express Scripts is the TRICARE program's pharmacy benefit manager, and representatives were on hand to present a review of their beneficiary engagement activities. Pharmacies located within military hospitals round out this massive volume by dispensing over 800,000 additional prescriptions each week.

Needless to say, this dispensing activity represents an enormous amount of beneficiary engagement in their health care.

Express Scripts also plays a significant role in helping move more beneficiaries into the Home Delivery program. To this end, they recognize that meeting and communicating with the beneficiary where they are most receptive and comfortable is instrumental to achieving a positive experience.
